

## Summer 2014 scripture meditation

Here are some tips on how to meditate on scripture. You don't need to do everything everyday, but may find it helpful to keep keep notes of any insights you have

1. Pray, ask God to speak through his word.
2. Read the passage through, emphasise a different word each time you read it.
3. Rewrite the verse in your own words
4. Ask what it tells me about God? What does it tell me about the Father, Jesus, or the Holy Spirit?
5. Ask what it tells me about myself?
6. Turn the verse into a prayer.
7. Pray about any insights you have
8. Talk to others about the verse and your insights

## Readings:

<b>Week beginning:</b>	<b>Verse</b>
27th July	Rev 4:11 "You are worthy, our Lord and God, to receive glory and honour and power, for you created all things, and by your will they were created and have their being."
3rd Aug	Col 1:19-20 "For God was pleased to have all his fulness dwell in him, and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making peace though his blood, shed on the cross."
10th Aug	Deut 7:7-8 "The LORD did not set his affection on you and choose you because you were more numerous than other peoples, for you were the fewest of all peoples. But it was because the LORD loved you and kept the oath he swore to your forefathers that he brought you out with a mighty hand and redeemed you from the land of slavery, from the power of Pharaoh king of Egypt."
17th Aug	2 Cor 5:21 "God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God."
24th Aug	Gal 3:26-28 "You are all sons of God through faith in Christ Jesus, for all of you who were baptised into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. There is neither Jew nor Greek, slave nor free, male nor female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus."
31st Aug	Acts 20:24 "However, I consider my life worth nothing to me, if only I may finish the race and complete the task the Lord Jesus has given me – the task of testifying to the gospel of God's grace."
